




ANNUAL REPORT

Financial Report

Though Heart Havens is primarily funded by Medicaid, we depend on donations to help cover what Medicaid doesn't pay for to ensure that the people we support are engaged as full and active members of their communities. This includes groceries for healthy, homemade meals, internet and phone plans, household supplies, vehicle expenses so our residents can participate in their community, recreation activities, home maintenance and repair, and incidental medical costs not covered by other insurance.




